Impact Across Diverse Sectors



WHITE HOUSE TO HOST BIG TECH AFTER PLEDGE TO REIN IN POWER COSTS


The White House is set to host major technology companies following their pledge to curb rising power consumption linked to data centres and AI infrastructure. With AI driving massive energy demand, governments are increasingly concerned about environmental and economic impacts.

It also reflects the Biden administration's broader effort to engage Big Tech on responsibility beyond profits. This stance signals a more assertive regulatory approach toward AI companies operating in Canada. Canada's warning underscores that voluntary commitments may no longer be sufficient, and that legal enforcement could follow if companies fail to address public safety concerns.




GOOGLE TO TEST CHANGES TO SEARCH RESULTS AS EU FINE LOOMS

Google is reportedly preparing to test changes to its search results in response to mounting regulatory pressure from the European Union. With the threat of hefty fines under EU competition laws, the company is exploring adjustments that could give rival services more visibility and reduce accusations of self-preferencing. This evidence adds weight to arguments that platforms knowingly exploit behavioural psychology to maximise engagement. The case is being closely watched as it could influence future regulation and liability standards for tech companies. If courts accept such arguments, social media firms may face stronger obligations to redesign products with user well-being in mind.

Chinese AI firm DeepSeek has reportedly decided not to release its latest model to U.S. chipmakers, including Nvidia. The move reflects growing geopolitical tensions and export control disputes surrounding advanced AI technologies. By limiting access, DeepSeek may be responding to U.S. restrictions on chip exports to China or seeking to protect strategic advantages. The decision highlights how AI development is increasingly shaped by national interests and trade policies. As global supply chains fragment, companies on both sides face uncertainty, potentially slowing collaboration and innovation in an already highly competitive AI landscape.

FROM DATING SCAMS TO FAKE LAWYERS: OPENAI DETAILS CHATGPT MISUSE IN THREAT REPORT

OpenAI has released a threat report detailing how ChatGPT has been misused for activities ranging from dating scams to impersonating lawyers. The report outlines patterns of abuse, mitigation efforts, and improvements to detection systems. By publicly acknowledging misuse, OpenAI aims to demonstrate transparency and responsibility. The findings also illustrate the dual-use nature of generative AI, which can be exploited despite safeguards. The report contributes to ongoing debates about AI governance, emphasising the need for continuous monitoring, user education, and collaboration with authorities to reduce harm while preserving beneficial uses.





OPENAI HIRES META AI RESEARCHER WHO PREVIOUSLY LED APPLE'S MODELS TEAM

OpenAI has reportedly hired a senior AI researcher from Meta who earlier led Apple's internal models team, signalling intensifying competition for top talent in the AI industry. The system is aimed at acting like a digital worker that can plan, execute, and monitor complex workflows such as research, scheduling, document creation, and analysis with minimal human intervention. By integrating reasoning, memory, and tool use, Perplexity Computer reflects the broader industry push toward AI agents that can operate independently. The development signals growing competition among AI firms to offer productivity-focused systems that reduce manual effort while raising new questions about reliability, oversight, and responsible deployment.

one side of each bread slice.


2. Add boiled corn and sprinkle black pepper.

- Tape (optional)


Steps:





Long study hours, constant revision, mock tests, parental expectations, and comparison with peers can create intense pressure. It may seem as though these exams define your future entirely. But before anything else, it is important to understand this—an examination is a phase of life, not the measure of your worth.

The Nature of Academic Pressure

When students begin to equate marks with personal value, stress intensifies. Sleepless nights, anxiety, self-doubt, and fear of failure become common experiences.

Examination pressure is real, but so is resilience. Mental health must be treated as essential, not optional. Success is a continuum, not a single event. For students standing at this critical stage: your effort matters, your well-being matters more, and your future is larger than any one test.
