
VIVO PREPARES FEBRUARY PUSH WITH V70 SERIES



NETFLIX FACES SENATE HEAT OVER MEDIA POWER

Netflix's co-CEO has faced intense questioning from a U.S. Senate panel over the company's proposed deal involving Warner Bros. Lawmakers raised concerns about competition, media concentration, and consumer impact. The grilling reflects heightened scrutiny of streaming giants as they reshape entertainment markets. Netflix defended the deal as necessary for scale and creative investment. However, regulators remain wary of consolidation reducing choice. The hearing signals a broader shift: streaming platforms are no longer disruptive outsiders but dominant players subject to oversight. As entertainment merges with big tech, questions of power, fairness, and cultural influence are moving firmly into the political arena.



MUSK'S SPACE MERGER LOOKS BEYOND EARTH

Elon Musk's merger of SpaceX and xAI signals an ambitious bet on futuristic data centres operating beyond Earth. The vision blends space infrastructure with artificial intelligence, aiming to overcome terrestrial limits on energy and computing. While critics see science fiction, Musk frames it as long-term necessity. The move reflects his belief that future technological growth depends on space-based solutions. AI JOLTS US SOFTWARE STOCKS





AID GROUPS WARN ON MEDICINE ACCESS

Médecins Sans Frontières has cautioned that the proposed India–EU free trade agreement could restrict access to affordable medicines in India and other developing nations. The organisation fears stronger intellectual property rules may delay generic drug production. India’s role as the “pharmacy of the global south” is central to the concern. Any disruption could affect treatment for HIV, tuberculosis, and cancer worldwide. The warning highlights tensions between trade liberalisation and public health. As negotiations continue, the challenge lies in balancing innovation incentives with humanitarian needs. Medicine access, activists argue, must remain a global priority, not a bargaining chip.

SNAP SEES AD REVIVAL

Snap has reported stronger-than-expected fourth-quarter revenue, buoyed by increased holiday advertising spend. The results suggest a cautious recovery in digital ad markets after months of uncertainty. Snap credited improved targeting tools and advertiser confidence. While challenges remain from larger rivals, the performance offers reassurance to investors. The upbeat numbers reflect how seasonal spending still matters in the digital economy. Snap’s rebound shows that niche platforms can survive volatility with focused strategies. As advertisers reassess budgets in an AI-driven landscape, platforms that demonstrate engagement and adaptability may yet carve out sustainable growth despite intense competition.




INSTAGRAM OUTAGE HIGHLIGHTS FRAGILITY

CHEETAH DREAMS IN THE DESERT

The proposal reflects a growing trend of ambitious rewilding projects backed by wealth and political will. Whether conservation can succeed outside historical ranges remains debated. The discussion highlights desperation and creativity in saving species on the brink. For the Asiatic cheetah, survival may depend on bold, unconventional choices.

 6. Bake in an oven or heat covered on a pan until cheese melts.
 7. Serve hot directly in the kulhad.
- Chef's Tip: Cover the kulhad while heating to melt the cheese evenly.



Tradition in Ice: How the Sapporo Festival Preserves Local Culture

The survival of local culture in a globalized world depends not on resistance to change, but on meaningful adaptation. In northern Japan, the offers a compelling example of how tradition can be preserved through creativity, community participation, and cultural consciousness. Far more than a tourist spectacle, the festival functions as a living cultural institution.

HISTORICAL ROOTS AND COMMUNITY ORIGIN

The Sapporo Snow Festival began in 1950 as a small, local initiative when school students created simple snow statues in public spaces. Its origin reflects a collective spirit rather than commercial ambition. This grassroots beginning remains central to the festival's identity, as local res-



idents, volunteers, and public institutions continue to actively participate in its organization and execution.

SNOW AS A MEDIUM OF CULTURAL MEMORY

In Hokkaido, snow is an inseparable part of daily life. The festival transforms this natural condition into an artistic

and cultural medium. Snow and ice sculptures frequently depict historical figures, traditional architecture, folklore, and regional symbols. These temporary structures act as visual narratives, allowing culture to be experienced rather than merely observed.

Key Ways the Festival Preserves Local Culture

- Active involvement of local communities and institutions
- Representation of Japanese history, folklore, and regional identity in sculptures
- Promotion of traditional food, music, and performances
- Use of local materials and seasonal environment
- Intergenerational participation, passing cultural values forward
